Course Descriptio n

This is a practical workshop. Our focus will be the lettering style used in famous manuscripts such as the Lindisfarne Gospels and the Book of Kells. We will examine the historical versions and then write our own version, using a metal broad-edged nib (although the originals would have been done with a quill, of course). Everyone will have the opportunity to write out a short text of your own choice, and to decorate the initial letter with colour, in the style of the period.

Skills or qualifications needed for entry into the class

Although this workshop is aimed mainly at students who already attend a weekly calligraphy class, newcomers are also welcome and will find the workshop accessible

Course aims & objectives

- To observe the characteristics of the Half-Uncial script in the 8th century Lindisfarne Gospels manuscript.
- o To use an edged pen to write own version of the script.
- To write out a poem or other text in the Half-Uncial script and add an optional small touch of decoration

Join an ongoing weekly calligraphy class if not already attending.

Items in **bold** will be available to purchase from the tutor on the day. Please bring some cash if you wish to purchase items. £5 to £10 will be sufficient.

- Portable drawing board. There will be a few available to borrow from the tutor, but please state when booking that you will require one. You would also need to bring a couple of rolls of kitchen towel to prop the board up, or other suitable prop.
 - Cartridge or drawing paper
 - Watercolour paper (hot pressed) optional a sheet approx A3 size should be plenty
 - Tracing paper
 - Calligraphy pens/nibs
 - Black ink (non-waterproof) such as Chinese ink or Sumi ink
 - Old brush for loading pen (or you can dip the pen in the ink)
 - Gouache (optional) or watercolour paint, or coloured pencils
 - Palette or suitable pots for paint if used
 - Pencil
 - Ruler
 - Masking tape
 - Water pot or jam jar
 - Rubber
 - Folder for handouts
- A short poem or other text you would like to write out—if you have not done calligraphy before, up to 4 lines will be about right — or longer if you already have calligraphic experience. A sheet of suggested texts will be available as well if you would like further ideas.

Enrolments in person, for all our courses, can take place from our office based at Comberton Village College. Secure payment links for courses, can also be sent out via emails or text messages. This process would involve you being notified in advance, of a secure link due to be sent shortly afterwards.
