




<p><b>Course Title</b></p>	<p>Mental Health First Aid Champions Training Course Become an MHFA Champion</p>				
<p><b>Course Description</b></p>	<div data-bbox="612 602 1251 801" data-label="Image">  </div> <p>This one-day mental health awareness and skills course (formally MHFA Lite) qualifies you as an MHFA Champion, an additional support to mental health first aiders. This course is ideal for organisations who wish to train their employees to support existing mental health first aiders (MHFA), as well as empowering individuals to increase their own wellbeing and reduce stigma. This course focuses on mental health in the workplace and associated strategy and legislation. To gain the full skill set of a MHFAider you must attend the two-day course (available at Cambourne 17-18<sup>th</sup> Oct 2020). There is a minimum age of 19 to enrol on an Adult MHFA course.</p> <p>This one-day mental health awareness and skills course qualifies you as an Adult MHFA Champion. <p><b>Tutor Details</b></p>	<p><b>Jenny White</b> has been delivering training for nearly 10 years. Her background is in corporate HR where she completed her CIPD qualifications, then more latterly in nursing, spending five years on a general Paediatric ward in Cambridge. The two careers combined make her a personable and knowledgeable trainer. Jenny set up the Bridge First Aid in 2014 after leaving the NHS and has expanded the business to meet demands. Jenny is currently training in Equine Facilitated Therapy. She is qualified to deliver all regulated First Aid courses and also fully qualified to deliver Mental Health First Aid which she says is a privilege. Jenny has also completed the Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST) which trains frontline staff in early intervention. Basic skills really do save lives.</p>

## Course aims & objectives

### What to expect:

We limit numbers to 16 people per course in order that the instructor can provide sufficient support to all participants. The day includes a mix of presentations, group discussions and workshop activities. You will get an MHFA manual to keep and refer to whenever you need it. When you complete the day you will receive a certificate to verify that you are an MHFA Champion.

#### Session 1

- About Mental Health First Aid
- About mental health and stress in the workplace
- Stigma and discrimination
- Depression
- Anxiety disorders
- Other mental health issues (eating disorders, self-harm, psychosis)
- Early warning signs of mental ill health
- Alcohol, drugs and mental health

#### Session 2

- Applying the Mental Health First Aid action plan
- Action 1: Approach the person, assess and assist with any crisis
- Suicide
- Action 2: Listen and communicate non-judgementally
- Action 3: Give support and information
- Action 4: Encourage the person to get appropriate professional help
- Action 5: Encourage other supports
- Recovery
- Building a mentally healthy workplace
- Action planning for using MHFA

### **Eligibility criteria\*\***

In order to qualify for a FREE place on this course, you must be eligible for us to claim funding to cover the costs. The eligibility criteria is as follows:

- Aged 19 or older on 31 August 2020
- You are a citizen of a country within the European Economic Area (EEA) or other countries determined within the EEA, including those with bilateral agreements such as Switzerland, or have settled status or the Right of Abode in the UK, **AND** have been ordinarily resident in the EEA or other countries determined within the EEA, including those with bilateral agreements such as Switzerland, for at least the previous 3 years on the first day of learning

**PLUS** any of the criteria listed below

- Low skilled (prior attainment level 2 and below or no qualifications at all)
- Low waged earning less than £17004 annual gross wage
- Unemployed
- Furloughed
- Learning will support progression to further relevant learning or employment

- Shielded residents/Covid-19

Proof of the above must be provided at time of enrolling and be applicable on first day of the course.
