Course Title	<p style="text-align: center;">Pattern Cutting & Garment Making Workshop</p>			
Course Description	<p>In this 2 day pattern cutting and garment making workshop, learners will focus on drafting a pattern block for their chosen garment of a skirt or trousers, to then go on to sewing the garment. The learner will be taught how to take body measurements, learn the basic rules to creating garment components from a pattern, checking the fit of the garment, altering pattern pieces, lay marking pattern pieces, cutting and sewing the garment.</p>

Skills or qualifications needed for entry into the class		<p>You should have an interest in pattern cutting, basic sewing skills will help but no previous skills or qualification is required.</p>		

Course aims & objectives

Day 1:

- Focusing on the chosen design of a skirt or trousers.
- Taking personal body measurement or using standard body measurements.
- Drafting the pattern block using the body measurements.
- Trace off all pattern pieces - labelling with all relevant information.
- Laying/marking pattern pieces for cutting in Calico to sample.
- Sew sample of the garment to check the fit, alter pattern and make any adjustments.

Day 2:

- Continue with sewing the sample to check the fit, alter pattern and make any adjustments.
- Laying/marking pattern pieces for cutting in chosen fabric.
- Sew garment including pressing and finishing.

Progression – after this course what might you do next?

Continue with other pattern cutting and garment making courses, creating garments including more advanced techniques.

How progress & success will be recorded

Q&A, 1 to 1 discussions/feedback and reviews. Completed samples are to be kept by the learner.

Additional course costs (e.g. visits, materials, books, equipment)

It would be helpful to come to the first session with an idea of your chosen garment to make, this could be a sketch, magazine cutting or photo. In order to participate in the practical exercises you will need to purchase some tools / equipment. If you choose to make up your garment in your chosen fabric this will be discussed in the first session.
