Course Description	<p>The Functional Mathematics course aims to promote mathematical thinking and transferable skills (rather than rote learning) with a particular focus on problem-solving and being able to apply these skills effectively in real situations. Candidates will be encouraged, inspired, moved and challenged by following a broad, coherent, satisfying and worthwhile course of study. Learners will be helped to develop confidence in (and to have a positive attitude towards) mathematics and to recognise the importance of mathematics in their own lives and to society.</p> <p>This course is free for adults who need to improve their mathematics skills and who will be expected to undertake the exam to gain the qualification.</p>

Skills or qualifications needed for entry into the class			Commitment to the full course, a willingness to take part in class exercises and to work independently, including at home. This is a live online class, you are expected to be present and engaged with the tutor and other learners during every lesson.		

Course aims & objectives

The course will raise awareness of how improving numeracy can assist in your life by realising its use in everyday situations and the “world of work”.

Functional Skills maths places great emphasis on ‘doing Mathematics’ and relating this, wherever possible, to everyday life. Certain techniques and formulae need to be learnt, but the emphasis on ‘doing’ means that you will work carefully through the practice work in class. It is then vital that you consolidate your knowledge by working through examples and exercises at home (direction will be given for this) in order to be able to solve problems effectively on your own.

This course aims to enable candidates to:

- develop knowledge, skills and understanding of mathematical methods and concepts
- acquire and use problem-solving strategies
- select and apply mathematical techniques and methods in mathematical, every day and real world situations

Progression – after this course what might you do next?

You may return to Functional Skills next year to achieve a higher level qualification. After achieving Level 2 Functional Skills you may be able to enrol on a GCSE Mathematics course.

How progress & success will be recorded

Your progress will be monitored throughout the course. This will include completing an individual learning plan (ILP), checking your progress via on-class activities, group discussions covering (and resolving) common difficulties with topics, regular performance assessments, completion of practice papers (towards the end of the course) and mock exams.

Finally, in term 3, you will sit the Functional Skills examination at the appropriate level for the skills you have acquired throughout the year.

Additional course costs (e.g. visits, materials, books, equipment)

Other equipment: a scientific calculator, a compass (for drawing circles), a protractor, a ruler, pen, pencil, paper and a file to keep your work in (or an exercise book).

You must bring photographic ID and attend an assessment and enrolment session before the start date of the course.

- **Eligibility criteria ***
- In order to qualify for a FREE place on this course, you must be eligible for us to claim funding to cover the costs. The eligibility criteria are as follows:
- Aged 19 or older on 31 August 2024
- You are a citizen of a country within the European Economic Area (EEA) or other countries determined within the EEA, including those with bilateral agreements such as Switzerland, or have settled status or the Right of Abode in the UK (including Afghanistan, Hong Kong and Ukraine) **AND**
- have been ordinarily resident in the EEA or other countries determined within the EEA, including those with bilateral agreements such as Switzerland, for at least the previous 3 years on the first day of learning (does not apply to Afghanistan, Hong Kong and Ukraine)
- you must attend a minimum of 85% of the classes
- you must fully complete an enrolment form
- You must complete an individual learning plan (ILP) on a regular basis (like a diary)

If you do not qualify for a free course, then you can attend by paying the relevant fee.

Enrolment and Payment

Please enrol at Comberton Village College for all courses, including those in Cambourne, Melbourn and online. Please assume the class is running once payment has been received unless you hear to the contrary.
