Course Description	<p>There are three units to this course - Reading, Speaking & Listening and Writing. You will need to pass all three units to gain a nationally recognised certificate.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This course is free for adults who need to improve their English skills and who will be expected to undertake the exams to gain the certificate (subject to meeting funding criteria). • Functional Skills are practical skills that allow learners to work confidently, effectively and independently in life. • Learners will work towards gaining a nationally recognised Functional Skills English qualification at an appropriate level, related to their individual ability. <p>Course material will cover the use of English in real-life, everyday settings.</p> <p>This course requires you to develop and commit to your own personal learning, as a result you will be expected to complete and submit weekly homework set by your tutor and carry out further learning between classes in order to fulfil the course objectives and earn the certificate.</p>

Eligibility criteria *

In order to qualify for a FREE place on this course, you must be eligible for us to claim funding to cover the costs. The eligibility criteria are as follows:

- Aged 19 or older on 31 August 2023
 - You are a citizen of a country within the European Economic Area (EEA) or other countries determined within the EEA, including those with bilateral agreements such as Switzerland, or have settled status or the Right of Abode in the UK (including Afghanistan, Hong Kong and Ukraine)
- AND**
- have been ordinarily resident in the EEA or other countries determined within the EEA, including those with bilateral agreements such as Switzerland, for at least the previous 3 years on the first day of learning (does not apply to Afghanistan, Hong Kong and Ukraine)
 - you must attend regularly, more than 50% of the classes
 - you must fully complete an enrolment form
 - You must complete an individual learning plan (ILP) on a regular basis

If you do not qualify for a free course, then you can attend by paying the relevant fee.
