


Course Title	 <h1>Introduction to Music Arrangement using Software</h1>				
Course Description	<p>This series of workshops provides a taster of which free software, sound libraries, and platforms are available to use on your home computer to create and publish your own arrangements. The course is aimed at adults who have some computer literacy and can play an instrument, such as a piano or guitar.</p> <p>The sessions look at how to set up your own Digital Audio Workstation (DAW) by taking you through the process of building and using sound libraries, creating tracks, rendering audio output, and extracting scores for publication.</p> <p>The sessions look at the development of one arrangement in a demonstration format. Some music theory will be taught along the way. Students can take files home and work on them to share in the next workshop session. The workshops culminate in the preparation of a score which can be published on one of the self-publishing platforms. Notes are provided to accompany each session.</p>

Skills or qualifications needed for entry into the class			Learners should have good computer literacy, such as knowing how to install and configure applications and how to use web search facilities. Learners should be able to play an instrument but previous experience of arranging a piece of music before is not necessary.		
Course aims & objectives					
Aim: The goal of the course is to provide an appreciation of the key software and stages involved in arranging, recording, and publishing a piece of music by using a computer.					

<p>Objectives: Install a professional Digital Audio Workstation such as Reaper. Find and install sound libraries such as LABS+. Create tracks in Reaper. Assign sound libraries to tracks. Record MIDI tracks in Reaper. Import audio files into Reaper. Arrange and duplicate tracks in Reaper.</p> <p>Apply effects to master tracks or to individual tracks. Set stereo positions of individual tracks. Render audio output in different formats. Output MIDI file of arrangement and import into score publisher. Layout score and output a PDF.</p> <p>Know the general principles about placing instruments in the vertical and horizontal planes so that they do not interfere with one another harmonically or in the stereo field.</p>	
<p>Progression – after this course what might you do next?</p>	
<p>Learners may want to watch resources on YouTube or read Reaper documentation on the Web to try more advanced arrangements involving multiple tracks.</p> <p>Learners may want to investigate or purchase more extensive sound libraries to give their arrangements greater depth and variety.</p>	
<p>How progress & success will be recorded</p>	
<p>Learners will set up their own DAWs at home and share files from these in class as homework. These can be evaluated in class in the form of a Q & A session, where recommendations can be made, or alternative ways of working can be shared in the group.</p>
