Course Title	<p style="text-align: center;">Mental Health First Aid Champions Training Course Become an MHFA Champion</p>				
Course Description	<div style="text-align: center;">  </div> <p>This one-day nationally recognized mental health awareness and skills course (formally MHFA Lite), qualifies you as an MHFA Champion. This course is ideal for organizations who wish to train their employees to support fully qualified *mental health first aiders, as well as empowering individuals to increase their own wellbeing and reduce stigma. This one-day course focuses on mental health in the workplace, although MHFA Champion skills are transferable outside of work.</p> <p>MHFA Champions have:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • An understanding of common mental health issues • Knowledge and confidence to advocate for mental health awareness • Ability to spot signs of mental ill health • Skills to support positive wellbeing • A good foundation of evidence based Mental Health First Aider skills <p>This course also covers legislation around stress and Mental Health in the workplace and your employer's duty of care, (as part of the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974, and The Equality Act.)</p> <p>*To gain the full skill set of a MHFAider you would need to attend a full two-day course. There is a minimum age of 19 to enrol on any Adult MHFA course.</p>

<p>Tutor Details</p>	<p>Jenny White has been delivering training for 13 years. Her background is in corporate HR where she completed her CIPD. More latterly Jenny changed careers into nursing, predominately in Children's services (Paediatrics) at Addenbrookes Hospital. These two roles combined make her a holistic and personable trainer with a broad skill set.</p> <p>Jenny set up the Bridge First Aid Ltd in 2014 after leaving the NHS and has since expanded the business in line with an ever-changing landscape. She is qualified to deliver all regulated physical First Aid courses and completed the MHFA England approved instructor training in 2018, now offering the full catalogue of MHFA England programs which she says, is a privilege.</p> <p>Jenny has also completed the Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST) which trains frontline staff in early intervention.</p> <p>Jenny is currently training in Equine Facilitated Therapy and one day hopes to combine her love of horses and animals, her passion for learning about neuroscience and her creative flair, to develop her own courses. Jenny states she wants to provide actionable skills that support individuals suffering from burnout, mental health issues caused by shift work, and the bumpy recovery journey from a mental health issue or illness.</p>

<p>What to expect:</p> <p>First and foremost, we create an inclusive space where everyone will feel welcomed. The day includes a mix of presentations, group discussions and workshop activities. You will get an MHFA manual to keep and refer to whenever you need it. When you complete the day you will receive a certificate to verify that you are an MHFA Champion.</p> <p><i>“The course helped me evaluate the support I have given in the past (when my work colleague experienced mental ill health) and provided information to help me improve the way I support people in future.”</i></p>			

Learning outcomes:

Session 1

- About Mental Health First Aid
- About mental health and stress in the workplace
- Stigma and discrimination
- Depression
- Anxiety disorders
- Other mental health issues (eating disorders, self-harm, psychosis)
- Early warning signs of mental ill health
- Alcohol, drugs and mental health

Session 2

- Applying the Mental Health First Aid action plan
- Action 1: Approach the person, assess and assist with any crisis
- Suicide
- Action 2: Listen and communicate non-judgementally
- Action 3: Give support and information
- Action 4: Encourage the person to get appropriate professional help
- Action 5: Encourage other supports
- Recovery
- Building a mentally healthy workplace
- Action planning for using MHFA

Eligibility criteria *

- In order to qualify for a FREE place on this course, you must be eligible for us to claim funding to cover the costs. The eligibility criteria are as follows:
- Aged 19 or older on 31 August 2023
- You are a citizen of a country within the European Economic Area (EEA) or other countries determined within the EEA, including those with bilateral agreements such as Switzerland, or have settled status or the Right of Abode in the UK (including Afghanistan, Hong Kong and Ukraine) **AND**
- have been ordinarily resident in the EEA or other countries determined within the EEA, including those with bilateral agreements such as Switzerland, for at least the previous 3 years on the first day of learning (does not apply to Afghanistan, Hong Kong and Ukraine)
- you must fully complete an enrolment form
- You must complete an individual learning plan (ILP)

If you do not qualify for a free course, then you can attend by paying the relevant fee.
