Course Description	This course is an introduction to the knowledge and understanding needed to work in a school or college environment, focusing mainly on the role of teaching assistants.  Whether retuning to work after raising a family or seeking new challenges, this course is aimed for learners who would like to consider working as a teaching assistant or other similar, support roles within an education setting. You will need to be highly motivated with a very positive attitude, ready to engage with others in the class and be able to work independently.  This course will give you a good understanding of how schools and colleges operate, and the varied roles within them, whilst also improving your knowledge and confidence to complete a job application pack, update your CV and prepare for potential interviews.  This course will be delivered in the Blue Space in Cambourne, with a scheduled site visits to Comberton Village College during some of the sessions.

- Understand safeguarding policies and procedures for young people and vulnerable adults
- Develop good communication skills to work alongside and build relationships with children, young people and adults within an education setting
- Investigate the different areas and departments within schools and colleges and their associated job roles
- Learners will be involved in various group activities from whole class to paired work and will have the opportunity to contribute by way of discussions and presentations.
- A CV or job application is your chance to show an employer your skills and experience, so you can confidently apply for the jobs you want. This course will also focus on completing an application pack for advertised job roles and help you improve your interview techniques

# **Progression – after this course what might you do next?**

Study for an English or maths GCSE or functional skills Level 2 programme. Level 2 or 3 Certificate in supporting teaching and learning.

# How progress & success will be recorded

Your progress will be regularly reviewed and recorded with the tutor. You will also have an independent learning plan which you will fill in every week to map your learning journey with us. Independent Learning Plans (ILPs) will be used for you to monitor your progress with your tutor's guidance.

Discussion with the tutor will help you feel confident with your next steps, on completion of this course.

#### **Funding**

#### Eligibility criteria \*

To qualify for a FREE place on this course, you must be eligible for us to claim funding to cover the costs. The eligibility criteria are as follows:

- The Authority has introduced the earnings threshold as part of a new eligibility criteria that enables you to be fully funded if you earn below £30,491, on the start date of the course
- Aged 19 or older on 31 August 2025
- You are a citizen of a country within the European Economic Area (EEA) or other countries determined
  within the EEA, including those with bilateral agreements such as Switzerland, or have settled status
  or the Right of Abode in the UK AND
- have been ordinarily resident in the EEA or other countries determined within the EEA, including those with bilateral agreements such as Switzerland, for at least the previous 3 years on the first day of learning (currently does not apply to Afghanistan, Hong Kong and Ukraine)
- Funding is limited for this course and you must have a high level of attendance
- You must complete an enrolment form to join the course and an individual learning plan (ILP) on a weekly basis

If you do not qualify for a free course, then you can attend by paying the relevant fee. Please note, we can arrange a payment schedule of instalments for this course.

#### **Enrolment and payment**

Enrolments in person, for all our courses, can take place from our office based at Comberton Village College. Please note, the quickest way to enrol onto a class will be to visit our website and follow the online booking links from there. We are a cashless school. We accept card and cheque payments (made payable to The Cam Academy Trust), from our office based in Comberton Village College. Online enrolments can be paid directly in GBP (Sterling) via a secure server over the internet by debit or credit card. Online enrolment will ask for additional information that will enable us to register you, on your chosen course and allocate your payment accordingly.

Your debit/card details will be encrypted via a payment processing company Stripe, payment information is not held on college servers. If you are paying online for a course, you will also be asked for contact information to be provided. This information will be held by the college, so we are able to contact you if required.

Secure payment links for courses, can also be sent out via emails or text messages. This process would involve you being notified in advance, of a secure link due to be sent shortly afterwards. If required card payments, in person, can also be taken at the beginning of each term, via a portable payment system.

#### Refunds

If you choose to withdraw your booking, at least 2 weeks before the start date of a course, a refund will be given, minus a £5 administrative charge. Refunds are only available in the event of course cancellation or early closure from the college.
