Course Title	Digital Photography for Beginners							
Course Description	This course is intended for those who have a digital camera and wish to progress beyond using the Auto Mode. Any camera that can be set to aperture priority is suitable. If your camera has a dial that looks like this for example then it is suitable. Please email your camera make and model if in any doubt and I can confirm its suitability. You will learn the basics of the camera functions the relationship between shutter speed, aperture, and ISO to equip you with the knowledge to improve your camera skills. We will discuss all the technical aspects of taking control of your camera along with composition, balance and what makes a 'good photograph'. Each week there will be a presentation with course content followed by a discussion of images taken by students for the previous week's assignment.

- Correct exposure
- The rule of thirds
- Composition and why images look good
- The common photography mistakes and how to solve them
- RAW, jpg and image sizes and formatting.

The course has sufficient flexibility to cover areas of photography beyond those listed and where students require help.
