Course Description	Learners will be taught how to sew with jersey fabric (stretch fabric) using their own domestic sewing machine or overlocking machine. You will gain an understanding of the fabric characteristics, sewing techniques and terminology that will enable the learner to progress onto sewing a garment from a commercial pattern of your choice. You will receive continual support from the tutor on working to assemble your garment to a professional finish.

Skills or qualifications needed for entry into the class	You should have an interest in sewing with jersey fabric, having basic sewing skills will help, however no previous skills or qualifications are required.

By the end of the course learners should: • Know how to use a lockstitch sewing machine • Know how to use an overlocking machine. • Understand Jersey (Stretch) Fabric and its characteristics. • Understand the pattern markings and terminology on commercial patterns. • Developing a variety of sewing techniques e.g. overlocking seams, sewing pockets, attaching sleeves, sewing with elastic, folded band edge, neckline and hemming. • Understanding the importance of the fabric grainline and lay planning. • Know how to assemble a garment in the correct order. • To complete a wearable garment of your choice at the end of the course.

To fully participate in the practical exercises, you will need to purchase some tools/equipment and fabric that can be purchased relatively cheaply online. This information will be given prior to the start of the course as a checklist. It would be helpful to bring along inspirational images/photos to discuss at the first session. Extra wide plain tracing paper is available to purchase from the tutor at a cost of £4.50 for 3 meters.	

Materials/equipment required for the sewing with jersey fabric class	Tools and equipment requirements will be discussed in the first session, however, <u>please bring a note pad and pen</u> to make notes during all sessions. Equipment requirements will include: • Learner's own domestic sewing machine or domestic overlocker with pedal foot/power cord and accessories such as bobbins and a bobbin case • A commercial Pattern - (Burda, Butterick, Kwik Sew, McCall's, New Look, Simplicity, Vogue Patterns, Tilly and The Buttons) • Jersey fabric of your choice (information will be found on the reverse of your chosen commercial pattern) • 1 spool of sewing thread in your chosen colour to match your fabric (if only using a domestic sewing machine) • 3-4 spools of thread in your chosen colour to matching your fabric (if using an overlocker) • Tracing paper (if you wish to not cut your commercial pattern) • Camera/Smart phone (to record the process) • Calculator • 2H or 2B pencil and sharpener or a mechanical pencil • Pencil Eraser • Biro's in Blue, Red and Green - or pens in various colours • Glue Stick • Masking Tape or Magic scotch tape • Paper Scissors • Fabric Scissors • Thread cutting scissors or Snippers • Seam unpicker • Twin needle for domestic sewing machine (for stretch fabric) • Stretch fabric machine needle (Size 90) • Metric tape measure Ruler • Ruler (60 cm or 1 meter) • Fine Steel dressmaker pins • Set Square or Pattern Master • Tracing Wheel

Enrolling

Enrolments in person, for all our courses, can take place from our office based at Comberton Village College.
