In this course learners are encouraged to continue to develop their artistic practices, regardless of their level of proficiency.

How progress & success will be recorded

Learners will record their progress through completed work, one to one discussion with the tutor, self-assessment and group critiques.

Additional course costs (e.g. visits, materials, books, equipment)

Students are encouraged to attend the organised visits to local museums (Kettle’s Yard, Fitzwilliam). Transportation is at the student’s expense.

Materials/equipment required for first class

Watercolour paper
 Sketch paper.
 Watercolour and acrylic paints: black, white, yellow, red and blue (preferably primary colours rather than ready-made secondary or tertiary colours).
 Flat and round brushes of various sizes.
 Charcoal, either natural, compressed or in pencil form.
 Pencils HB, B1 to B6.
 Eraser or Putty.
 Masking tape.
 A glass/jar/container for water.
 Absorbent sponge or cloth.
 Ruler.

Not essential but please bring the following if you have some at home: chalk pastels, sanguine, board or table easel

If you have not attended a painting and drawing course before you do not initially need to purchase all the materials on the list above for the first class. Please bring sketch paper (A4) and soft pencils (B4 or B6) and whatever colouring material you might have at home. Please note that we use water-based material (not oil).
