



# CAM ACADEMY TRUST COURSE INFORMATION

<b>Skills or qualifications needed for entry into the class</b>		None			
<b>Course aims &amp; objectives</b>					
<p>This is a one day springtime watercolour course where we will be looking at techniques to enable you to produce an Easter design or a spring scene which could be used as a card or present for someone special. You might like to produce a picture of a spring landscape, blossom trees, blooming seasonal flowers and animals associated with springtime, such as rabbits, butterflies, deer, etc. or something more abstract. Alternatively, you might want to do a watercolour and collage image instead.</p>					
<b>Progression – after this course what might you do next?</b>					
<p>You will be able to use this artwork to make into Easter cards or to frame and give as a present. The techniques used will also useful in producing further artwork.</p>					
<b>Materials/equipment required for first class</b>		Please bring:  Paper or board suitable for watercolours – 300gsm or heavier.			

	<p>Some watercolour brushes: round and a fan type brush are very useful. I use Kolinsky sable or the Perla White Toray brushes size 14/16.</p> <p>A sketchbook to try ideas out on</p> <p>2 jam jars or similar for water</p> <p>Kitchen towel</p> <p>Pencils: HB or B, 4B and a 4H.</p> <p>Tracing paper – a couple of A4 sheets.</p> <p>Putty rubber</p> <p>Watercolour paint in either tubes or pans.</p> <p>Anything you might want to draw from –plant material, photographs on your phone of a winter scene etc..</p> <p>For collage work, please bring different bits of paper and pva glue and a spreading brush or spatula.</p>
