


<p>Course Title</p>	<p>Paper Making for Beginners</p>				
<p>Course Description</p>	<p>This course is intended as an introduction for those who wish to explore and experiment with the process of making paper. There will be short demos to show techniques and different processes along the way. Work will be self-directed with personal projects being achieved for each student.</p> <p>The course will initially explore how to make pulp, followed by demos of different techniques of dipping and pouring paper.</p> <p>Students will then be given the opportunity to experiment with basic papermaking creating their own outcomes. We will experiment with colour blends and layering.</p> <p>Further experimentation incorporating texture and added elements will be covered if time allows.</p> <p>At the end of the course, you will be able to take away your own collection of papers (to press and dry at home) that you will be able to incorporate in sketchbooks, card making and other projects.</p>

<p>Tutor Details</p>	<p>Tracey Altmann is the technician from Comberton Village College who supports the art department with the GCSE and A Level art and photography students. She also teaches local art classes in the afternoons. A Graphic Designer and Choreographer by trade, she has worked in various art forms since graduating from both Witwatersrand University (1992) and Dundee College (2002).</p> <p>Artist statement: I love experimenting in varied art forms like film, photography, origami, painting, dance, choreography, crochet, design, printing, ceramics and papermaking to name a few. My journey in art began as a child when I was introduced to origami (paper folding). My discovery of the versatility of paper, love of creating and being open to observing art in everyday life, was inspired by my aunt, who is an international paper artist. As a graphic designer by trade, I have always worked to a strict brief for clients like Swatch, Sony and SAP. In contrast, the art I create today is more accidental, rather than precise. Currently, I love making paper and abstract art where there is no brief to fulfil and I can create something for pleasure – free to be in the moment and able to express my emotions.</p>
