Course Description	The course is tailored to meet the needs of those who want to lean and practice pattern drafting, cutting and to generally study the art and core skills involved. You will study the basic pattern block making process, which you can then go onto creating your own garment. Tutor led demonstrations to help practice and develop your skills.

Skills or qualifications needed for entry into the class			You should have an interest in pattern cutting for clothing, basic sewing skills will help, however no previous skills or qualifications are required.			

Upon completion of the course learners should:

- Understand the use of tools and equipment used for pattern cutting.
- Understand the principles and terminologies of pattern cutting.
- Be able to draft a pattern block using given measurements.
- Be able to create finished pattern blocks, labelled with the correct information.
- Understand different fabrics, grainlines, and lay plans.
- Be able to sew a sample from the pattern pieces.
- How to adapt and amend pattern pieces for a correct fit.
- Develop skills in flat pattern cutting.

Set square or Pattern master. 2H or 2B pencil or mechanical pencil. Eraser. Calculator. Tracing Wheel. Awl. Metric tape measure. Biros in Blue, Red and Green or pens in various colours. Paper scissors. Fabric scissors. Glue stick. Masking tape or scotch tape. Fine steel dressmaker pin or beaded head pins.
