Course Description

The aim of the course will be to give students an opportunity to gain an understanding of woodwork techniques and experience new processes. The course will allow students to understand the theory behind the subject as well as have the opportunity to design and build individual projects. Ideally learners will have attended Woodwork for Beginners course before the intermediate workshop.

Skills or qualifications needed for entry into the class

Ideally learners will have attended a term of Woodwork for Beginners classes previously.

Course aims & objectives

This course will allow students to gain an understanding of woodwork techniques and processes. An opportunity to learn new skills and to use a range of hand and electrical tools. Students will construct a range of small projects to practice new skills, techniques and processes. A final project will then be manufactured towards the end of the course. Students will be given set briefs for the smaller skills-based projects but will be given an opportunity to design and plan their final project.

Opportunities to gain basic DIY skills could be an option if students wanted to go down this route for one or two lessons. The course is very fluid and flexible and can be designed in part around the individual student's prior experience.

Progression – after this course what might you do next?

The course runs for 8 weeks and students wanting to continue into the next academic year would be given more advanced and challenging projects to design and manufacture.

How progress & success will be recorded

Practical examples and demonstrations will be given. Supervised practical work will take place in class. Each student will be given full notes to support the work in class.

Additional course costs (e.g. visits, materials, books, equipment)

Materials are included in the fee for the basics of the course, however, once you progress to an individual project you may be required to purchase the materials you require for this.
